➔ Jackson Hole in **WYOMING** has emerged as a world-class ski destination, but powder isn't its only competence: a good Indian summer is one of the finest times to enjoy its cinematic landscapes. Opening just in time for this is **Caldera House** (calderahouse.com; from \$2,500 to \$4,500 for a two-bedroom suite), a haute hotel with a prime location right in Teton Village, a two-minute walk from the Mountain Resort tram. Caldera House considerably ups the ante on a stay in these parts: design firms Commune and Carney Logan Burke are responsible for the spare but sumptuous interiors in the two- and four-bedroom suites; and its owner,
